This year's [initial watch list](#), announced on March 1, recognized the top 50 men's and 50 women's candidates for the Tewaaron Award.

Five men's and five women's finalists will be announced on May 10 and invited to The 18th annual Tewaaron Award Ceremony in Washington, D.C., on May 31.
