



TEWAARATON AWARD ANNOUNCES ADDITIONS TO THE 2021 MEN'S AND WOMEN'S WATCH LISTS

WASHINGTON, DC, April 2 – The Tewaaron Foundation has announced additions to the 2021 Tewaaron Award Men's and Women's Watch Lists.

The initial 2021 Watch Lists that were announced on March 11 included the top players across all three divisions of NCAA lacrosse to highlight the early contenders for this year's Tewaaron Award. These April additions represent players from 13 men's programs and nine women's programs.

The Tewaaron Award annually honors the top male and female college lacrosse player in the United States. The selection committees are made up of premier collegiate coaches and are appointed annually by The Tewaaron Foundation.
