TEWAARATON AWARD, PRESENTED BY UNDER ARMOUR, ANNOUNCES MEN'S AND WOMEN'S WATCH LISTS ADDITIONS

WASHINGTON, March 19 – The Tewaaraton Foundation has announced the first round of additions to the 2015 Tewaaraton Award Men's and Women's Watch Lists, presented by Under Armour. Players not named to the initial list (announced Feb. 26) have several opportunities to play their way into a spot as the season progresses. A second round of Watch lists additions, if applicable, will be announced on April 9. On April 23, the field will be narrowed to 25 men's and 25 women's nominees. Nominees can be players on the watch lists or players not on the watch lists, effectively allowing for a third round of additions. Five men's and five women's finalists will be announced on May 7 and invited to the ceremony. The Tewaaraton Award Ceremony will be held in Washington, D.C., on May 28, 2015, at the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of the American Indian.
